

## Coastal Carolina Bowl History

The Chanticleers will be making their 5th bowl game appearance with the 2024 Myrtle Beach Bowl, holding a 2-2 record. Last year, Coastal Carolina beat San Jose State 24-14 in the EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl.

Coastal Carolina made their bowl debut in the 2020 FBC Mortgage Cure Bowl, falling to Liberty 37-34 in Orlando, Florida. With their appearance in this year's Myrtle Beach Bowl, the Chanticleers have been to a bowl game in five consecutive seasons.

## UTSA Bowl History

The Roadrunners will be making their sixth bowl game appearance since moving to the FBS level in 2013. Overall, UTSA holds a 1-4 record in bowl games, including a 35-17 win over Marshall in the 2023 Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl.

After their inaugural season in 2011 and joining the FBS level in 2013, the Roadrunners made their bowl debut with a 23-20 loss to New Mexico in the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl. With their appearance in this year's Myrtle Beach Bowl, UTSA has also made a bowl game in each of the last five seasons.

## Myrtle Beach Bowl History

The inaugural Myrtle Beach Bowl was held on Dec. 21, 2020, and featured a 56-28 victory for Appalachian State (SBC) over North Texas (C-USA) at Brooks Stadium. Mountaineers' running back Cameron Peoples set the all-time NCAA bowl game record with 317 rushing yards and five touchdowns in the win.

In 2021, Tulsa (AAC) defeated Old Dominion (C-USA) 30-17 on December 21, 2021, at Brooks Stadium. Golden Hurricane quarterback Davis Brin threw for 285 yards and two touchdowns and was named MVP after the game.

The 2022 edition saw Marshall (SBC) hold off UConn (Independent) to grab a 28-14 victory on December 20th, 2022 at Brooks Stadium. Thundering Herd running back Rasheen Ali rushed for 92 yards and one touchdown to bring home MVP honors.

Last year, Ohio (MAC) used a strong running attack to dominate Georgia Southern (SBC) 41-21 on December 16th, 2023 at Brooks Stadium. Bobcats' running back Rickey Hunt rushed for 115 yards and four touchdowns en route to being named MVP.

## The Game

Coastal Carolina (6-6, 3-5 SBC) and UTSA (6-6, 4-4 AAC) meet in the fifth annual Myrtle Beach Bowl at Brooks Stadium in Conway, South Carolina. The game kicks off at 11:00 a.m. (ET) and will be televised by ESPN.

Both teams will be making their first Myrtle Beach Bowl appearance.

Coastal Carolina (6-6, 3-5 SBC) clinched bowl eligibility for a fifth consecutive season with a 48-27 win over Georgia State in their final regular season game. After starting the season 4-1, the Chanticleers finished in 5th place in the Sun Belt East division standings. The Chanticleers bring in one of the best offensive lines in the Sun Belt, giving up just 11 sacks for the season, the lowest in the conference. Coastal Carolina's defense also tallied 28 sacks, the fourth-most in the Sun Belt.

UTSA (6-6, 4-4 AAC) put together a three-game winning streak in November with victories over No. 25 Memphis, North Texas, and Temple to clinch bowl eligibility. UTSA finished seventh in their second year in the American Athletic Conference. During the season, the Roadrunners averaged 285.6 passing yards per game, the second most in the conference. UTSA's defense also racked up 38 sacks to lead the conference, while recovering the second-most fumbles in the conference with 10.

## The Series

The Myrtle Beach Bowl will be the first-ever meeting between Coastal Carolina and UTSA.

## TODAY'S GAME

### Eagles Part of Record Sun Belt Bowl Representation

Eight Sun Belt programs will participate in Bowl Season in 2024, marking the third-straight year that it paces all non-autonomy conferences in bowl representation. The Sun Belt produced seven Bowl Season participants in 2022 and a conference-record and national-best 12 in 2023.

## BROOKS STADIUM



The Coastal Carolina University football stadium officially opened as Brooks Stadium on Sept. 6, 2003, for the inaugural home game of the Chanticleer football program. Scoring a touchdown with just seconds left on the clock, the Chanticleers defeated Newberry College 21-14.

With a gift from the late businessman Bob Brooks, the stadium was named in honor of Brooks' children Coby Garrett and Boni Belle. The \$2 million gift was among the largest gifts ever made to the University.

Brooks, who grew up on a farm in Loris, S.C., was the CEO and founder of Eastern Foods, Inc., creators of the Naturally Fresh line of products, and chairman of Hooters of America, Inc. He also created Hooters Air Charter Airline, the National Golf Association Hooters Tour and the Hooters ProCup Series, a series of short-track races in small towns throughout the Southeast and Midwest. Brooks died in 2006.

Phase I of the stadium construction included 6,408 seats, while Phase II added almost 1,000 additional seats prior to the 2006 season. The third phase of Brooks Stadium was completed in 2010 when approximately 1,600 seats were added directly behind the north end zone. Affectionately referred to as the Chantourage section, the seating directly in front of the field house was designated as the student section in 2011.

Brooks Stadium has been ranked among the top stadiums in the nation in attendance based on capacity. In 2010,

the Chanticleers hosted a first-round NCAA Division I Football Championship playoff game against Western Illinois. The game marked the first postseason game played in Brooks Stadium.

On Feb. 15, 2013, the women's lacrosse team opened its inaugural season on its new home field inside Brooks Stadium. Women's lacrosse was the 18th Division I sports program for the Chanticleers.

The facility underwent a major transformation in the spring of 2015 as Benton Field went from natural grass to artificial teal turf ... or "The Surf Turf." The first pieces of Powerblade SD turf were laid on April 2 and the project was completed later that month. The project had a budget of \$1.2 million.

Brooks Stadium was designed and built with the capability to expand from its inception. That original design is coming to fruition as Coastal embarked on another two-phase expansion in the spring of 2017 that will ultimately bring the capacity to approximately 20,000.

The first phase boosted the seating capacity to at 15,000 and included adding seats to both corners of the end zone nearest the field house, expanding the sections closest to the field on both sides toward the scoreboard, and expanding the upper deck on the east side to match the length of the lower deck.

Prior to the 2019 season, a second level and premium suites were completed on the west side to increase the capacity to 20,000. The cost of the two-phase project was \$31.8 million.







# 2021 RECAP

The Tulsa Golden Hurricane (7-6) passed for 285 yards and rushed for 244 more in a 30-17 win over the Old Dominion Monarchs (6-7) in the second edition of the Myrtle Beach Bowl on Monday evening. Tulsa's offense held the ball for just under 40 minutes in the program's 11th bowl game victory.

Tulsa finished off their season with four consecutive wins, while Old Dominion dropped their first game since October 16th and saw their five-game winning streak snapped. The postseason matchup was the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

Golden Hurricane quarterback Davis Brin completed 22 of 34 passes for 285 yards and two touchdowns in the victory. The redshirt junior was named Myrtle Beach Bowl MVP following the game after setting a Myrtle Beach Bowl game record for passing yards.

Brin connected with senior receiver Josh Johnson for eight receptions and 129 yards, including a 23-yard touchdown catch in the opening quarter. Redshirt senior receiver JuanCarlos Santana added six catches for 75 yards, while redshirt sophomore tight end Ethan Hall caught a four-yard touchdown pass for his lone reception of the night. Senior running back Shamari Brooks rushed for 109 yards on 26 carries and a touchdown to help the attack.



After surrendering a 100-yard kickoff return to begin the game, the Golden Hurricane defense gave up just 10 more points the rest of the game and held Old Dominion to only 71 rushing yards in the contest. Graduate student linebacker Yohance Burnett led the team in tackles with six total, with senior defensive lineman Jaxon Player added the team's only sack with his five total tackles.

Graduate student kicker Zack Long knocked in field goals of 25, 32, and 35 yards to set a new season high.

Old Dominion tallied 247 yards of total offense and converted five of their 11 third downs in their second-ever bowl appearance. Monarchs' redshirt freshman quarterback Hayden Wolff threw for 176 yards on 19 completions and one interception in the defeat. Sophomore wide receiver Ali Jennings III was Wolff's favorite target with six receptions for 74 yards. Redshirt sophomore running back Blake Watson led the rushing attack with 77 yards on 14 carries and a two-yard touchdown.

Freshman linebacker Jason Henderson led the Monarch defense with nine solo tackles and season-high and 13 total, with redshirt junior safety R'Tarriun Johnson also collecting 13 stops setting a Myrtle Beach Bowl record for tackles. Senior linebacker Jordan Young posted his second sack of the year and was a force in the Golden Hurricane backfield with three tackles for loss.

Despite a late scare, the Marshall Thundering Herd (9-4) held off the UConn Huskies (6-7) 28-14 to claim the third annual Myrtle Beach Bowl title on Monday evening. Marshall forced four turnovers in route to the program's 13th bowl victory, and first since 2018.

The Thundering Herd ended their season on a five-game winning streak, the first time they have finished a season with five straight wins since 2002. Making their first bowl appearance in seven years, the Huskies dropped their second-consecutive game to Marshall, falling in the 2015 St. Petersburg Bowl 16-10.

Marshall running back Rasheen Ali rushed for 92 yards on 15 carries with a long of 38 in the victory. The redshirt-sophomore was named Myrtle Beach Bowl MVP for his performance.

With Ali leading the rushing attack, quarterback Cam Fancher completed 10 of 20 passing attempts for 93 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. The redshirt-freshman connected with six different receivers, with Corey Gammage leading the way with three receptions for 50 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown catch for the first score of the game. The offense finished with 303 yards of total offense, with 210 coming on the ground.



As they have been all year, the Thundering Herd defense was impressive as they held a team to 21 points or less for the ninth time this season. Marshall picked off UConn three times with Micah Abraham, Damion Barber Jr., and Gammage all collecting interceptions. Eli Neal racked up 10 total tackles with 1 ½ tackles for loss and a pass breakup to pace the defense.

After falling behind early, UConn found their offense in the second half with 189 of their 316 total yards coming after halftime. Freshman quarterback Zion Turner committed four turnovers with three interceptions and one fumble. Turner passed for 166 yards while completing nine of his 27 attempts. His favorite target on the day was sophomore wide receiver Aaron Turner, who made five catches for 65 yards and a long of 33.

The Husky offense was balanced with 172 yards through the air and 144 on the ground. Freshman running back Victor Rosa found the end zone twice on runs of 14 and 24 yards while finishing the game with 75 yards on 16 rushes.

The Huskie's defense forced two turnovers on a forced fumble by senior linebacker Ian Swenson and an interception by redshirt-sophomore defensive back Malik Dixon-Williams. Graduate linebacker Brandon Bouyer-Randle collected 10 total tackles to lead the Huskies.

The Ohio Bobcats used a well-rounded performance to defeat the Georgia Southern Eagles 41-21 in the fourth edition of the Myrtle Beach Bowl.

Defense was the key to the game for the Bobcats, as it was all season. They forced a Myrtle Beach Bowl record-setting five turnovers and held the Eagles to just 33 rushing yards. Three different players collected interceptions with a pair of forced fumbles, led by sixth-year safety Jeremiah Wood with one interception and a forced fumble in the victory.

With five total touchdowns in his first bowl game, Ohio freshman running back Rickey Hunt was named Myrtle Beach Bowl MVP with 115 yards through 17 carries on the ground, and one touchdown catch for 17 yards. The five touchdowns tied a Myrtle Beach Bowl record.

After seeing limited action throughout the season, graduate student quarterback Parker Navarro commanded the offense with 11 completions on 16 attempts for 120 yards and one touchdown. The Bobcats' offense did not turn the ball over throughout the game.

In his second Myrtle Beach Bowl performance, Eagles' quarterback Davis Brin broke his own bowl game record with 350 passing yards, eclipsing the previous record he set with Tulsa in the 2021 game. Brin completed 32 of 42 passes with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

It was a defense-heavy first quarter as Ohio quickly picked off Brin on just the fourth play of the game. Gianni Spetic knocked in a 27-yard field goal to give Ohio an early 3-0 lead with 6:27 left in the first. Ohio got the ball back following a Georgia Southern punt and punched in their first touchdown on a two-yard run by Hunt to lengthen the lead to 10-0 with 12:22 left in the half.

Following the second Georgia Southern punt, Ohio used a four-play drive to take control, highlighted by a Navarro 24-yard run and an 18-yard touchdown pass to Hunt with 3:16 left in the second. Just before the end of the half, Ohio forced their third turnover on a strip-sack. The half ended with a 26-yard field goal by Spetic as the home team entered the locker room with a 20-0 lead.

Ohio jumped out to leads of 27-0 and 34-7 in the third quarter, but Georgia Southern fought back to a two-score game at 34-21 early in the fourth quarter on Brin's second touchdown of the day.

However, the Eagles would get no closer and Hunt punched in his fifth score of the day with less than three minutes to play to put the game away.

An experienced leader with 36 years of coaching experience, Beck brought with him 18 years of Power 5 coaching experience to CCU, including spending the 12 years as an offensive coordinator at Nebraska, Ohio State, Texas and NC State.

He has led Coastal to a pair of bowl game appearances, including a win in the 2023 Hawai'i Bowl. As a collegiate coach, he has helped guide teams to 18 postseason bowl games, including this season. Beck has also coached in a postseason bowl game in every year since 2007, including helping Ohio State compete in the College Football Playoff in 2016.

In his first season in Conway, Beck led the Chanticleers to an 8-5 record and the second bowl victory in program history. Coastal reeled off five consecutive wins, including the program's first win ever at Appalachian State, while starting three different quarterbacks. The Chanticleers won five consecutive Sun Belt Conference games for the first time since 2020 and notched eight wins for the fourth consecutive season.

Wide receiver Sam Pinckney became the Sun Belt's all-time leader in receiving yards while also setting an NCAA record with 58 consecutive games.

The offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at NC State from 2020-22, Beck helped lead the Wolfpack to three-consecutive eight-plus win seasons, three-straight bowl appearances, and a combined record of 25-11.

Recognized as the nation's eighth-best recruiter by 247Sports.com in 2020, Beck has been a three-time nominee for the Broyles Award, an award given to the nation's top assistant coach in all of FBS.

Beck's NC State offense ranked in the top half of the highly-touted Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) in scoring offense, total offense, and passing offense, while continuing to set program records along the way.

Under Beck's tutelage, Leary set a new NC State school record for most touchdown passes in a single season in 2021 with 35. He became one of just three quarterbacks in ACC history to post a 3,400-yard and 35-touchdown regular season. He also passed for 27 touchdowns in ACC play, a mark that led the conference, and he became the first Pack quarterback to throw for four or more touchdowns against five ACC opponents.

Prior to joining the Wolfpack in 2020, Beck coached for three years as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Texas from 2017-19.

Before joining the Longhorns, Beck was at the offensive coordinator at Ohio State from 2015-16 where his offenses helped lead the Buckeyes to back-to-back double-digit win seasons, going 12-1 in 2015 and 11-2 in 2016.

Between 2011-14, Beck's Nebraska offenses ranked among the best in the Big Ten Conference and his passing attack amassed more than 10,000 yards during that time with 86 touchdowns. In his four seasons as coordinator, the Huskers averaged 33.5 points per game. The Huskers broke more than 50 individual records, including career marks for passing yards, completions, passing touchdowns, yards from scrimmage, and total offense.

## COACHES



Prior to Nebraska, Beck was at Kansas where he was the Jayhawks' receivers coach in each of his three seasons (2005-07). He was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2007.

Beck came to KU as one of the most respected high school coaches in the state of Texas, serving three seasons at Summit High in Mansfield. He was the 2003 District Coach of the Year, and a season later, Summit High advanced to the quarterfinals of the state playoffs with a 9-4 record.

Beck was head coach at R.L. Turner High in Carrollton, Texas, from 1999-2001, leading the school to back-to-back playoff appearances and consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 25 years. Beck was named the district coach of the year in 2000.

Prior to coaching in the Texas prep ranks, Beck worked at Missouri State for three seasons from 1996-98, including one season as the offensive coordinator.

Beck started his coaching career as an assistant at Miramar (Fla.) High School in 1988-89 and then moved to Illinois State as outside linebackers and punters coach in 1990. He spent two seasons on Bill Snyder's Kansas State staff (1991-92) as a graduate assistant.

An Ohio native, Beck played one year of football at Central Florida (1985), and he graduated from there in 1988 with a degree in liberal studies. He also has a master's in counseling and guidance from Kansas State University (1992).

# SEASON REVIEW



The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers dropped their first contest of the season, falling 43-24 to Virginia.

Virginia took an early lead after Coastal fumbled away the opening kickoff, scoring on the third snap to go up 7-0. The Cavaliers then turned a Chanticleer interception into another touchdown and built a 17-3 lead before Jameson Tucker hauled in a 29-yard pass from Ethan Vasko on 4th-and-2 to make the score 17-10 with 7:26 left in the first half. However, UVA scored the final 10 points of the second quarter to take a 27-10 lead into the locker room.

Coastal managed a three-yard touchdown run from Vasko in the third quarter and a 15-yard touchdown pass from Noah Kim to Bryson Graves, but Virginia pulled away with two touchdowns and a field goal for a final margin of 43-24.

Vasko finished with 222 yards, one touchdown and one interception on 10-of-21 passing, while also leading the rushing attack with 24 yards on eight carries. Kim was 6-of-12 through the air for 80 yards and a touchdown.

Graves led the receiving corps with four catches for 40 yards and a score. Tray Taylor caught three passes for 70 yards and added a 22-yard rush. Shane Bruce tied his career high with 11 tackles, while Wyatt Gedeon and Emmanuel Johnson each notched seven tackles with three solo stops apiece.

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers scored 28 consecutive points to erase a 10-point first-half deficit, then held on late to preserve a 45-37 win over Old Dominion in the Sun Belt Conference opener.

Coastal scored at least 40 points for the third time this season and amassed 515 yards of total offense while forcing three Monarch turnovers.

Ethan Vasko had a career night, throwing for 367 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-26 passing. Cameron Wright led the receivers with four catches for 148 yards and a touchdown, while Christian Washington rushed eight times for 89 yards. Braydon Bennett accounted for two touchdowns on the ground and added a receiving touchdown, tying a career-high for total touchdowns in a game. Bennett also surpassed the 2,000-yard mark for all-purpose yardage in his career.

Shane Bruce and Tobias Fletcher each accounted for eight total tackles to lead the Coastal defense.

Tied at 7-7, ODU scored the next 10 points to take a 17-7 advantage in the waning minutes of the second quarter.

Coastal responded with 28 unanswered points to take its first lead of the day and made enough plays down the stretch to hold on for the victory.

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers suffered their first conference loss of the season in a 39-7 road defeat at James Madison.

James Madison scored on its second possession to go up 7-0, but Coastal tied the score on a 40-yard touchdown pass from Ethan Vasko to Jameson Tucker with 4:30 left to play in the first quarter. However, the Dukes scored the next 32 points to earn the win, outscoring the Chants 22-0 in the second quarter.

Vasko finished 5-of-18 for 84 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. Noah Kim appeared in relief, going 4-for-7 for 18 yards. The Chanticleers managed just 79 yards on the ground, led by Braydon Bennett's 45 yards on 12 carries. Tucker led all Chant receivers with two catches for 44 yards and a touchdown.

CCU's two interceptions on offense marked the first time Coastal had thrown multiple interceptions in a game since Sept. 30, 2023, against Georgia Southern, snapping a streak of 13 consecutive games with one or fewer interceptions on offense.

Tobias Fletcher paced CCU's defense with a career-high 10 tackles, including six solo stops. AJ Williams tallied eight tackles, while Will Whitson notched five tackles, one sack, one TFL, and a quarterback hurry.

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers rallied from a 14-point second-quarter deficit but fell to the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns, 34-24.

Down 14-0 in the second quarter, Coastal got on the board with an 11-yard touchdown pass from Noah Kim to Kendall Karr. Louisiana extended the lead to 10 with a field goal, but the Chanticleers pulled within three when Braydon Bennett hauled in a four-yarder with 44 seconds left before halftime to make the score 17-14 at the break. Kade Hensley then converted a 29-yard field goal with 5:16 left in the third quarter to tie the score at 17-17.

After UL reclaimed the lead on the opening drive of the fourth quarter, the Chants responded when Bennett broke loose on an option pitch for a 49-yard run to pull even, 24-24, with 10:52 remaining in the game. However, Louisiana scored the final 10 points of the day to come away with the victory.

Kim came on in relief at quarterback and completed 16-of-25 passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns over the final three quarters. Bryson Graves caught three passes for a career-high 54 yards to lead all receivers. Bennett rushed 13 times for a career-high 132 yards and a touchdown, while catching a team-high five passes for 22 yards.

Juan Powell led the Chanticleer defense with a career-high 11 tackles, while Clev Lubin registered a season-high 2.0 sacks.

Coastal Carolina allowed 21 points in the second quarter and could not recover as the Chanticleers dropped a 38-24 decision at Troy.

After falling behind 7-0 late in the first quarter, than Vasko scrambled and dove into the end zone to tie the score at 7-7 with 1:12 left in the opening period.

Troy dominated the second quarter, forcing two Chanticleer punts and scoring on all three drives to take a 28-7 lead into the locker room.

Coastal got the game back within two scores twice in the third quarter, but its two possessions in the fourth quarter ended in turnovers on downs and Troy added an insurance field goal to claim the victory.

Vasko finished 18-of-34 for 206 yards with one touchdown through the air, while adding 20 yards and a score on the ground. Tucker was Coastal's leading receiver with 106 yards and a touchdown on six catches, while Bryson Graves added 58 yards on five receptions.

Bennett rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a touchdown while catching three passes for 14 yards.

Shane Bruce led the Chanticleer defense with 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, and one quarterback hurry. Tobias Fletcher chipped in seven tackles, including six solo stops.

The Mountaineers worked their way back to a one-score deficit before halftime after falling behind 17-0 early in the second quarter.

However, the Chanticleer defense forced three turnovers on the night, which Coastal turned into 17 crucial points.

Coastal set the tone early with a seven-play, 68-yard drive on the opening possession that Bennett capped with a 12-yard touchdown run, and the Chanticleers would remain in front the rest of the night.



# SEASON REVIEW



UTSA piled up 536 yards of offense and a school-record 35 first downs and held Houston Christian to just 177 yards in a 45-7 victory on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

UTSA's offensive output was the most since 643 yards against South Florida last year, and featured a balanced attack with 269 rushing yards – the most since 287 versus North Texas in 2023 – and 267 passing yards. The 35 first downs eclipsed the previous UTSA standard done five times before, most recently in the win against South Florida last fall.

Bryson Donnell and Brandon High Jr. each rushed for a game-high 74 yards, while Kevorian Barnes added 64 yards to lead the ground game, and Owen McCown completed 18 of 25 passes for 226 yards and three touchdowns. Devin McCuin had a team-best five receptions for 43 yards and a TD, and Willie McCoy racked up 85 yards and a score on two catches.

Defensively, Jimmori Robinson had seven tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack, one forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a blocked field goal to help the Roadrunners limit the Huskies to seven points and 50 rushing yards.

UTSA totaled seven TFLs, including four sacks, as Joe Evans, Owen Pewee and Ronald Triplette joined Robinson in the sack column.



Zah Frazier had two interceptions and UTSA posted 456 yards of offense, but East Carolina rallied from a 10-point deficit for a 30-20 victory in the American Athletic Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

The Roadrunners built a 13-3 first-half lead but the Pirates scored 24 unanswered points and held off a late UTSA rally to even the all-time series between the two teams at one apiece.

Frazier became the fifth Roadrunner to record two interceptions in a game and the first since Clayton Johnson in 2017 to help UTSA extend its streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 15. Martavious French paced the defense with eight tackles, including six solo stops and one tackle for loss, while Jamal Ligon became the second UTSA player to reach 300 career tackles after logging five, including a sack, to go with a forced fumble and one quarterback hurry.

Offensively, UTSA passed for 286 yards and rushed for 170. Brandon High Jr. led the ground game with 92 yards and a touchdown on just seven attempts, while Willie McCoy caught four passes for 91 yards. Owen McCown completed 24 of 49 passes for 251 yards and a TD and Chris Carpenter led all receivers with six catches for 61 yards.



Owen McCown passed for 256 yards and three touchdowns but E.J. Warner's TD pass to Matt Sykes with four seconds left lifted Rice to a 29-27 victory over UTSA on Saturday night in American Athletic Conference action at Rice Stadium.

Trailing 23-13 entering the fourth quarter, the Roadrunners rallied to reclaim the lead with back-to-back scoring drives. McCown found Devin McCuin on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 5:40 remaining to make it a three-point contest. The redshirt sophomore quarterback then connected with Houston Thomas over the middle on a 38-yard TD pass. Tate Sandell's extra point made it 27-23 with 2:06 on the clock.

However, Warner directed an eight-play, 65-yard scoring march that gave the Owls the lead for good. A defensive pass interference penalty gave Rice the ball at the UTSA 17-yard line. Following an offensive pass interference call that pushed the line of scrimmage back to the 32, Warner hit Drayden Dickmann on a 14-yard pass play to set up the game-winning, 18-yard touchdown pass to Sykes. Warner then took a knee on the point-after-touchdown attempt to leave the score at 29-27.

UTSA got the ball back for one last play following a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, but the Rice defense came up with the stop to seal the win.

UTSA used a balanced offensive attack to set a school record for total yards and Zah Frazier picked off two passes for the second time this season to help guide the Roadrunners to a 48-27 victory over North Texas in American Athletic Conference action on Friday night at the Alamodome.

The Roadrunners racked up 681 yards of offense on the night, rushing for a season-high 302 yards and passing for 379 in their fourth straight win over the Mean Green.

Owen McCown directed the record-setting offensive output, completing 29 of 43 passes for 379 yards and two touchdowns to notch his fourth 300-yard game of his redshirt sophomore campaign. The Rusk, Texas, native also rushed for a career-best 88 yards on 10 attempts, giving him 467 yards of offense.

Meanwhile, Robert Henry Jr. gashed the Mean Green for 168 rushing yards and a pair of TDs on 20 carries. His 83-yard touchdown dash with fewer than three minutes remaining helped seal the win and pushed the Roadrunners' ground game over the 300-yard mark for the first time since gaining 304 in a road win versus Western Kentucky in 2021.

Defensively, Frazier's second two-interception game of the year and Tyan Milton's late sack helped UTSA extend its streak to 20 consecutive games with both a takeaway and a sack.

Jimmori Robinson set school records for sacks and tackles for loss, Zah Frazier had two interceptions for the third time this season and UTSA piled up 529 yards of offense in a 51-27 victory over Temple in American Athletic Conference action on Friday night at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners became bowl eligible for the fifth straight season and won their school-record-tying 10th in a row at home to improve to 29-3 at the Alamodome under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor.

Robinson registered 5.5 tackles for loss and four sacks to go with three quarterback hurries, helping UTSA break the school record for tackles for loss in a game with 16, bettering the previous mark of 15 posted against Tulsa last month.

Meanwhile, Frazier picked off two passes for the second straight game and third time overall this season, passing Clifford Chattman's single-season school record of five interceptions in 2022.

Offensively, the Roadrunners racked up 529 yards of offense, topping the 500-yard mark for the second straight game and fourth time this fall. UTSA rushed for 309 yards, notching the first back-to-back 300-yard games on the ground as Robert Henry Jr. paced the ground attack with 178 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries.

Syrus Dumas had a career-high 12 tackles and Brandon High Jr. rushed for two touchdowns, but No. 22 Army thwarted a late UTSA rally for a 29-24 decision in American Athletic Conference action on a chilly Saturday at Michie Stadium.

Dumas registered three stops behind the line, as UTSA tallied seven tackles for loss on the day to push this year's total to a school-record 104. The Roadrunners also recorded a pair of sacks and came up with their 21st takeaway of the fall to run those streaks to 21 consecutive games.

Army held a 13-10 advantage at halftime, but the Roadrunners took their first lead of the day after their opening drive of the second half ended with a 23-yard touchdown reception by Devin McCuin.

Army pulled to within 17-16 on the ensuing possession after a 23-yard field goal with 1:34 left in the third.

The Black Knights then came up with a fourth-down stop deep in UTSA territory to open the fourth quarter. Bryson Daily added a pair of TD runs from there to push the Army lead to 29-17.

UTSA cut the deficit to five on the next possession, covering 75 yards in just four plays, the last a 6-yard touchdown rush by High.

The Roadrunners then forced a missed field goal with just under two minutes remaining. However, Gavin Shields iced the game for Army with an interception off a tipped ball with 1:22 left.

## HEAD COACH



**JEFF TRAYLOR** has had an immediate impact on the program, university and city of San Antonio during his tenure since being hired as UTSA's third head coach on Dec. 9, 2019.

Traylor has turned around the UTSA football program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, which has led to positive results on and off the field. The Gilmer, Texas, native took over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and has led the Roadrunners to a 45-20 record in his first five years at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.692) by a coach in program history.

During the Traylor era, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached seven All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks.

That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom under Traylor's leadership, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, a William V. Campbell Trophy finalist, 12 CSC Academic All-District Selections and four conference all-academic team selections. Additionally, UTSA was one of only 13 FBS programs to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for graduation success.

Under Traylor's tutelage, UTSA enjoyed a record-setting campaign in 2021. The Roadrunners won their first 11 games, were nationally ranked as high as No. 15 and captured the program's first league title. UTSA capped the season with its second straight and third overall bowl appearance against San Diego State in the Frisco Bowl.

Traylor was honored as the 2021 Conference USA Coach of the Year, the AFCA FBS Regional Coach of the Year for Region 4 and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, AFCA National Coach of the Year and George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. A member of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year watch list, he was chosen as



the 2021 San Antonio Express-News Sportsman of the Year.

During his time in San Antonio, Traylor has overseen the development of several Roadrunners who have moved on to the professional ranks. In April 2022, UTSA doubled the number of NFL draft picks on one afternoon, as the 49ers selected Spencer Burford in the fourth round while the Seahawks picked Tariq Woolen one round later. Burford earned the starting spot at right guard in year one and Woolen has picked off half a dozen passes in his rookie campaign en route to being selected to the Pro Bowl. Additionally, his former players Cephus, Hicks, McCormick, Leroy Watson, Charles Wiley and Wisdom all have made active rosters or practice squads.

Traylor has more than 30 years of coaching experience including a highly successful 15-year career as head coach at Gilmer High School, where he led teams to three state championships and two state runner-up finishes and won more than 87% of his games, a winning percentage that ranks 10th all-time in Texas high school history.

Prior to coming to the Alamo City, the Gilmer native served as associate head coach and running backs coach for two seasons at Arkansas, where he helped sign the school's first top-20 recruiting class. Prior to that, he served in the same role at SMU for the 2017 season. He began his collegiate coaching career as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Texas in 2015 before becoming the Longhorns' associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach the following year.

Traylor built his hometown program into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure leading the Gilmer Buckeyes. A four-time Texas High School

Coach of the Year, he posted a 175-26 record (.871 winning percentage) and led Gilmer to five state championship game appearances, three state titles (2004, '09, '14) and 12 district crowns. The Buckeyes turned in a pair of perfect 16-0 seasons, won 10-or-more games 11 times and registered seven 13-win seasons and three 15-win campaigns during his career.

Inducted into the East Texas Coaches Association Hall of Honor in 2019, Traylor received numerous honors during his prep coaching career, including being named Coach of the Decade (2000s) by the Tyler Morning Telegraph. He is a 12-time District Coach of the Year, four-time East Texas Coach of the Year and a four-time Ted Jeffries Award winner. He has received the Carl Padilla Coach of the Year, KYKX Coach of the Year and Old Coach Network Coach of the Year awards twice each. He will be inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2025.

Traylor began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Big Sandy High School in 1990-93 before a seven-year stint (1994-2000) at Jacksonville High School where he served as passing coordinator, defensive backs coach, receivers coach and special teams coordinator. There, he helped coach future NFL quarterbacks Josh McCown and Luke McCown and former Texas A&M standout signal-caller Randy McCown.

A 1986 graduate of Gilmer High School, Traylor earned both undergraduate (1990) and graduate (2002) degrees in education from Stephen F. Austin while playing football as a walk-on.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children: Jordan, Jacob and Jaci.


being invited to the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) for one year (2012-13). Following a 10-year membership in Conference USA, UTSA joined The American in 2023.

One of the newest FBS programs, UTSA is in its 14th season of football in 2024. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the WAC for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners are making their fifth straight and sixth overall bowl appearance with the Myrtle Beach Bowl on Dec. 23, 2024.

UTSA Athletics boasts more than 80 conference championships, over 60 NCAA postseason appearances, 64 All-Americans and 25 Academic All-Americans.

UTSA student-athletes also have experienced much success in the classroom. As of the Spring 2024 semester, UTSA boasts an average team GPA of 3.08 while 57.9% of its student-athletes maintained a 3.0-or-greater GPA. In the latest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report released by the NCAA, UTSA set a department record with a 90% GSR, marking the 10th consecutive year with a GSR of 80% or above. Additionally, nine sports programs registered a perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 1,000 in the latest report.


UTSA also has built a reputation as an NCAA host institution. UTSA has served as host institution for more than 20 NCAA Championship events since 1997, including four Men's and three Women's Final Fours. 


## MYRTLE BEACH MVP

### 2020 - CAMERUN PEOPLES, APPALACHIAN STATE

The Lineville, Ala., native had 29 carries for 317 yards and five rushing touchdowns in the 56-28 win over North Texas at Brooks Stadium. Peoples set the all-time NCAA bowl record with 317 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns. He scored on runs of 3, 64, 62, 4, and 11 yards for the Mountaineers.

Peoples broke the single-game bowl record for most rushing yards, previously held by Georgia Tech's PJ Daniels, who had 307 rushing yards against Tulsa in the 2004 Humanitarian Bowl.



### 2022 - RASHEEN ALI, MARSHALL

Redshirt-sophomore running back Rasheen Ali finished with a team-leading 92 yards on the ground and a touchdown in the Thundering Herd's 28-14 win over UConn.

Ali missed the first 10 games of the season before returning to play in late November. In just his third game of the season, Ali rushed for a long of 38 yards and added a two-yard touchdown to complete Marshall's scoring in the third quarter.

### 2021 - DAVIS BRIN, TULSA

Redshirt junior Davis Brin entered the Myrtle Beach Bowl record books in the second annual game with 285 passing yards and a pair of touchdowns in the 30-17 victory over Old Dominion. Brin completed 22 of 34 passes and led the Golden Hurricane to hold the ball for just under 40 minutes and 35 first downs.

Brin passed for touchdowns of 23 and four yards, finding senior wide receiver Josh Johnson the most with eight receptions for 129 yards.



### 2023 - RICKY HUNT, OHIO

Freshman running back Rickey Hunt turned in a five touchdown performance in the Bobcats' 41-21 victory over Georgia Southern.

Playing in his first bowl game, Hunt recorded 115 yards on the ground on 17 carries with four touchdowns – scoring on runs of 2, 6, 40 and 9 yards. He complimented that with a 18-yard touchdown reception to tie the Myrtle Beach Bowl game record with five total touchdowns.
